***Mathematics:** Mathematics credits must be at the Algebra I level or equivalent and above.

***Washington State History and Government:** Credit requirement may be satisfied in middle school, or by successfully completing a high school level regional or state history and government course in another state. Students may also waive this requirement by successfully completing Civics if certain criteria are met.

***Health and Fitness:** Second year credit may be waived under certain conditions... see Board Policy 2127.

Students must also successfully earn a Certificate of Academic Achievement by passing the State Proficiency Exam in English Language Arts, Biology and Math; and completing a High School and Beyond Plan.

Additional Educational Opportunities

New Market Skills Center is available to junior and senior level students only. New Market provides career and technical education in 22 industry- standard programs. For more information visit their website: www.newmarketskills.com.

Olympia Regional Learning Academy (ORLA) utilizes iConnect, an online learning program that offers students grades 9-12 the opportunity to earn their high school diploma in a manner different than a traditional high school. This program is an option for students who are looking for more flexible scheduling, need to catch-up on credits, or who like to move through their classes at a pace that better fits their needs. Students can be enrolled on a full-time or a part-time basis. <http://orla.osd.wednet.edu>

Running Start is a cooperative program with the local community colleges open to juniors and seniors. Student must pass the Computerized Placement Test (CPT) in English and Reading, administered at South Puget Sound Community College in order to participate. Students receive both college and high school credit for 100 level and above classes completed. Students have the opportunity to earn an Associate of Arts degree simultaneously with their high school diploma.
